


Most of our economic development work happens behind the scenes and has a ground-up approach. Over the past year, Rebuild has invested over \$60,000 in home repairs for low-income residents with a focus on Safety & Accessibility. We saw record numbers of clients at the Superior Food Bank and have kept this critical service operating smoothly and fiscally responsible. We also continue to be stewards of the Superior Community and Veterans Cemetery where we host cleanups biannually.



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BOYCE THOMPSON ARBORETUM ADVANCES CONSERVATION THROUGH DUAL-TRACK INITIATIVE

Boyce Thompson Arboretum implemented two major campaigns this past year that highlight its commitment to desert plant conservation and community education. These complementary initiatives demonstrate how the century-old institution continues to evolve its mission of inspiring stewardship of arid ecosystems.

Having successfully completed the first year of its three-year partnership with Resolution Copper, BTA is now entering the second phase of this transformative educational initiative. Year one achievements included launching the design phase of the Children's Garden, hiring an Education Director, conducting teacher workshops with Copper Corridor schools, and acquiring an outreach vehicle. Year two expands the program with continued Children's Garden development, addition of an Outreach Coordinator, and implementation of Title I student fee offsets for field trips.

Simultaneously, the Propagating the Future Campaign seeks to upgrade critical infrastructure supporting plant conservation efforts. With 30% of BTA's 4,000+ plant species facing extinction threats, this initiative focuses on expanding propagation capabilities for endangered species like the critically rare Aloe brunneostriata from Somalia. The campaign will modernize greenhouse heating and cooling systems, replace deteriorating retail structures, and purchase essential equipment and vehicles, while supporting ecological restoration projects like post-Telegraph Fire recovery efforts.

Together, these initiatives will support both conservation and educational programs that will cultivate the next generation of desert conservation advocates. This dual approach ensures BTA can fulfill both its research mission and its responsibility

to share knowledge with surrounding communities, maintaining its founder, William Boyce Thompson's vision of making droughtresistant plants accessible for practical use.





The Superior Enterprise Center is driving innovation, growth, and opportunity in our community! Serving as a transformative catalyst, the Center fuels Superior's economic diversification through dynamic business services, cuttingedge workforce training, and vibrant community engagement. It's our one-stop hub for resources, training, and inspiration—connecting people, sparking ideas, and creating pathways to success.

Workforce development is at the heart of what we do. With state-of-the-art welding equipment and strategic partnerships with Resolution Copper and Central Arizona College, the Center is building the skilled trades workforce of tomorrow. After successfully serving more than 45 students through

our welding program in just three semesters, we're already preparing to launch more trade programs in the years ahead.

We're also inspiring the next generation. In partnership with Superior Soaring, our Fledgling Youth Program introduced local youth to the thrill of glider flight—planting the seeds for future aviators and bringing a unique aviation presence to our town.

For entrepreneurs, the Center delivers results. From intensive Launch Camps to our Youth Entrepreneurial Academy, we help turn bright ideas into thriving businesses. Our coworking and meeting space—complete with state-of-the-art audiovisual technology—offers a professional, flexible venue for collaboration, workshops, and virtual connections.

The Superior Enterprise Center is more than a building—it's a launchpad for dreams, a bridge to opportunity, and a driving force in shaping Superior's bright future!

MOONSHOT

The Superior Enterprise Center recently teamed up with Moonshot—a 24-year-old Arizona-based nonprofit with a mission to help bold thinkers bring products and services to market and to build thriving entrepreneurial ecosystems in rural communities.

Together, we hosted Superior's very first entrepreneurial pitch competition!

Ten talented participants from across the Copper Corridor stepped up to pitch their business ideas, ranging from artisanal baking to innovative hiking programs to artists ready to expand their creative ventures. The competition was fierce, with cash prizes of \$1,000 for first place, \$500 for second, and \$250 for third. Every participant also gained access to Moonshot's Constellation Program—a unique roadmap of resources and guidance to help founders turn dreams into reality.

The excitement doesn't stop here—the winner of Superior's Pitch Event will advance to compete for the statewide title and a \$10,000 grand prize. This milestone event not only celebrated local talent but also showcased Superior's growing role as a hub for innovation and entrepreneurship!

THE HIVE

Rebuild Superior and the Superior Enterprise Center have joined forces with the Institute for Digital Inclusion Acceleration (IDIA), a nonprofit committed to closing the digital divide, to bring a state-of-the-art community resource to life: The Hive.

The Hive is more than just a coworking space—it's a vibrant hub for digital access, creativity, and lifelong learning. The Hive offers a wide range of free resources, including access to high-speed internet, virtual reality goggles, 3D printers, Apple devices, and even a private telehealth room and a professional-grade podcasting studio.

What truly sets The Hive apart is its mission to serve the community with no cost tech support and workshops for all ages. Whether you're a senior needing help with a smartphone or a student eager to learn robotics, The Hive has you covered.

Since opening in March, The Hive has become a buzzing hub of creativity and innovation, welcoming an average of 20 visitors each day. From "Exploring Robotics with Spheros" to "Creating with AI" and "Podcasting," our workshops offer something for everyone. Community members—young and old alike—come to discover new technologies, sharpen their skills, and connect in a warm, inclusive space where curiosity thrives and ideas take flight.

This summer, The Hive hosted its first youth tech camp for students ages 10–17. Campers participated in hands-on learning experiences and created powerful public service announcements about the dangers of vaping. As a highlight, each student received a brand-new Apple iPad and presented their final projects at the Apple Store in Scottsdale.

The Hive is open to everyone, and all services are free of charge. Whether you're looking to gain digital skills, start a creative project, or just get connected, The Hive invites you to stop by—and get buzzing.



Superior has long been a small town with big ideas, built and rebuilt through resourcefulness, reuse, and innovation. That spirit guided the Town's bold decision to purchase and repurpose the original Superior High School into the Superior Multi-Generational Center (MGC)—a one-stop facility to improve services and enhance quality of life.

A phased build-out is underway. The Welding Shop is already open, with The HIVE co-working space launched in 2025. Future additions include the Recreation Center and Town Hall in 2026, followed by the Library and Senior Center in late 2026–early 2027, pending approvals.

By reimagining and upgrading a historic landmark, Superior is preserving its past while investing in its future. The MGC stands as a testament to the community's resilience and forward-thinking vision—providing resources, opportunities, and gathering spaces that will benefit residents for generations to come.

And there's more to celebrate! Superior High School will soon mark its 100-year milestone. Plans are underway for a Centennial celebration and all-town reunion to welcome alumni, families, and friends back home.
